All those interested in presenting a poster must submit an abstract online [here](#) by Friday, March 29th at noon (12:00).

The abstract submission should include:

- Presenter(s) Name and Contact Information
- Poster Title
- Abstract (maximum 1,000 characters) outlining:
 - What is the goal of the project/program/initiative/idea?
 - How does it relate to ACEs and/or trauma-informed care?
 - Who benefits?
 - Who is involved?
 - What are the results to date?
 - How can others get involved?

- Each presenter will have a space of 48 inches by 36 inches to display their poster; please ensure you bring your fully prepared, printed poster to set up on May 9th.
- Poster set-up will take place from **06:00 to 07:30 on Thursday, May 9th**. All posters must be ready to present at **07:30** and taken down by **16:30** on the same day.
- Storyboard abstracts will be reviewed by the Summit Planning Committee, and confirmation for presentations will be sent by April 15th.

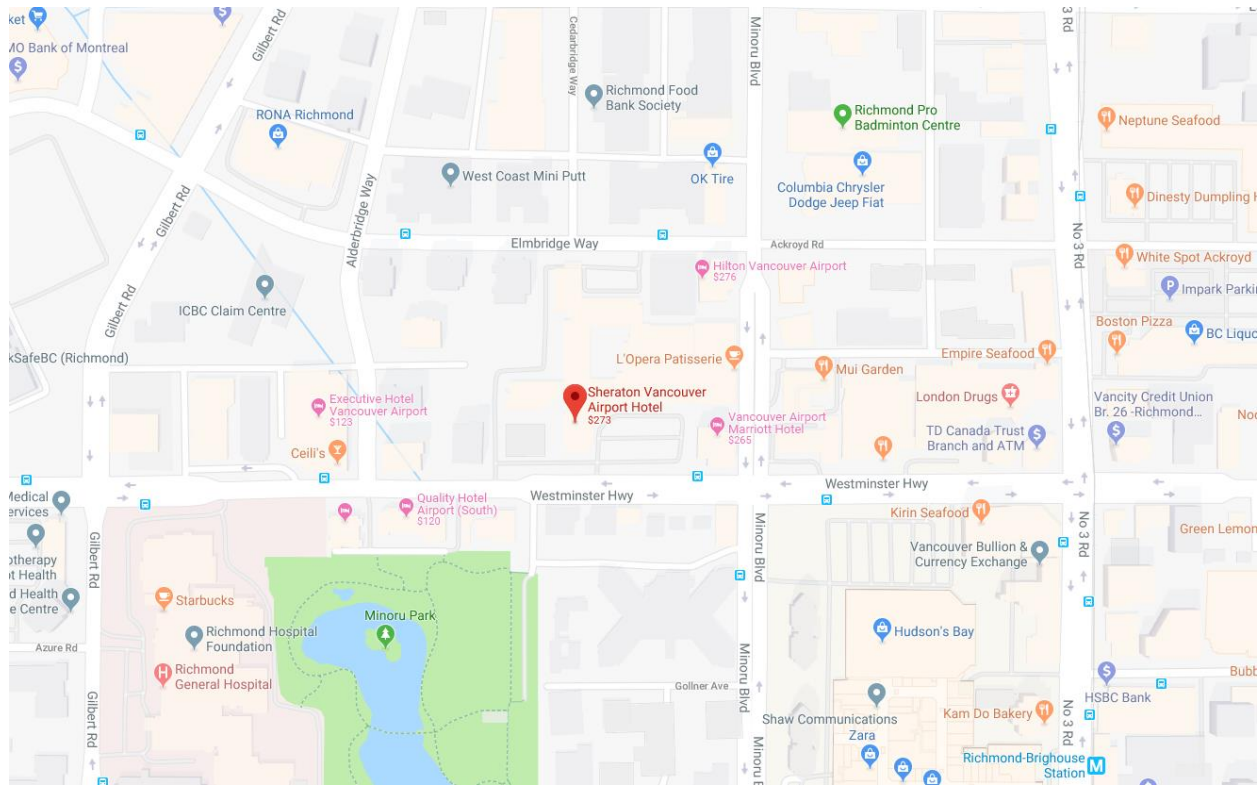
Accommodation
