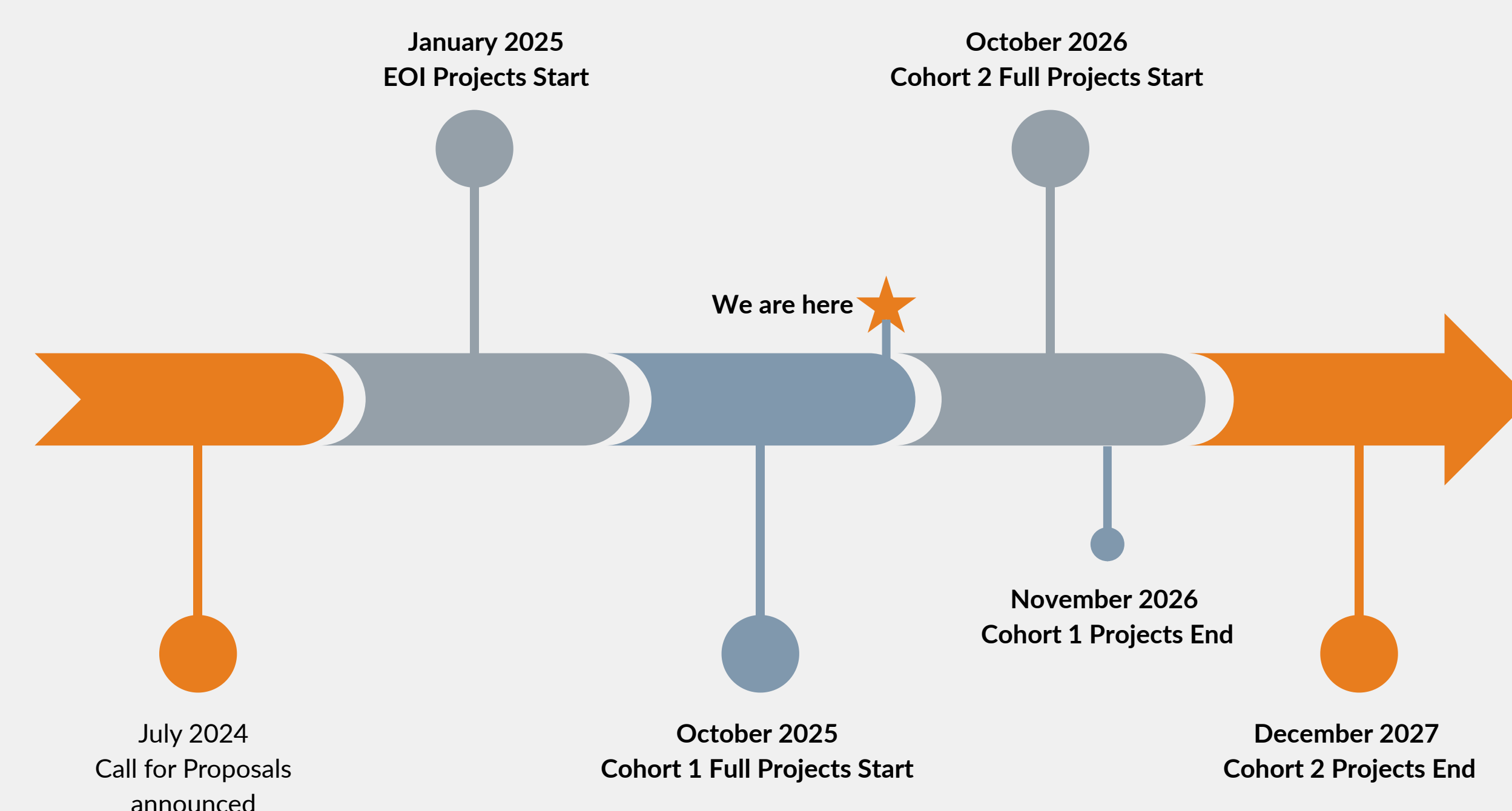


Shared Care Cancer Call for Proposals: Supporting physician-led improvements in cancer care in BC

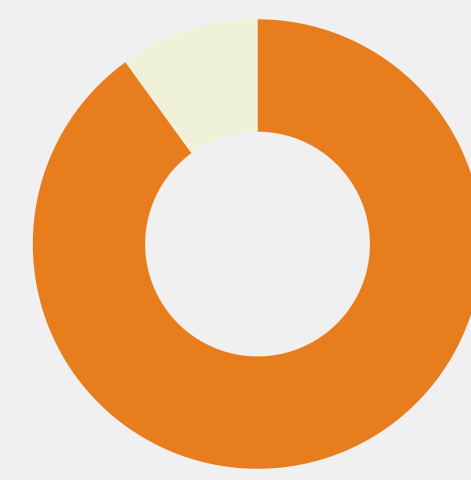

From provincial strategy to practice change

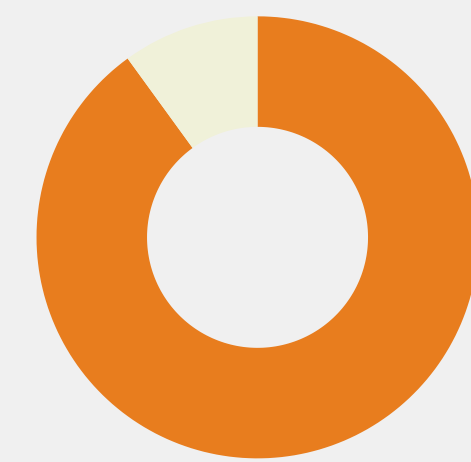
The Shared Care Committee (SCC) Cancer Call for Proposals was designed to align with BC's 10-Year Cancer Action Plan, translating provincial priorities into practical, physician-led improvement projects. The initiative is a new approach to Shared Care, bringing together a cohort of physician-led projects and partners passionate about improving cancer care.

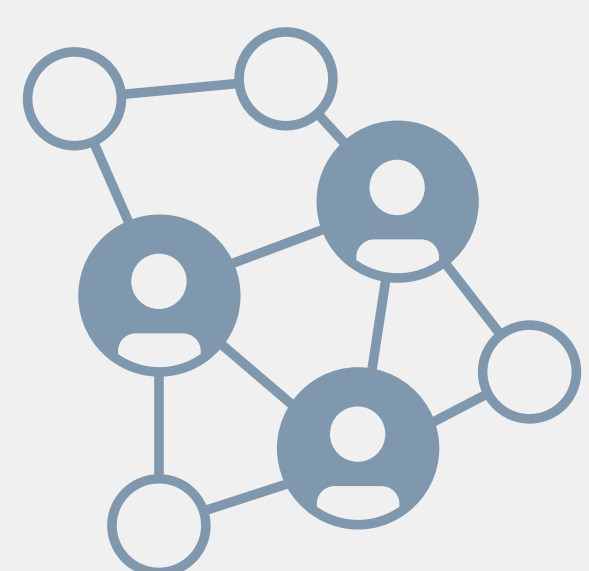

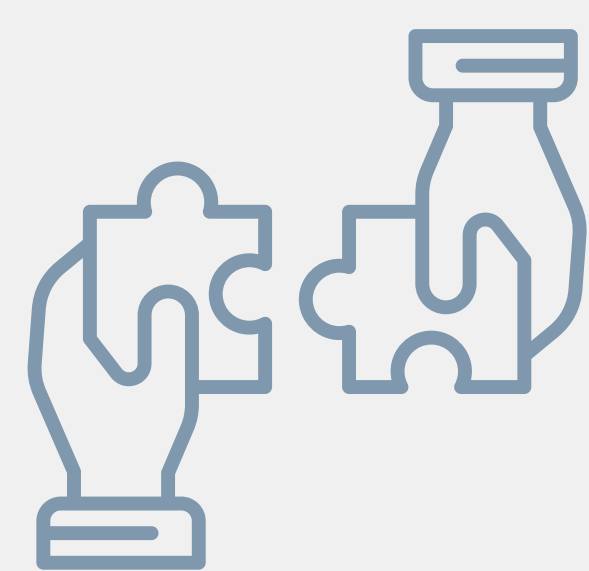

Impact: Partnership development

The most significant impact of the SCC Call for Proposals to date has been the connections made. This novel initiative has successfully linked clinicians and **leaders from the regional health authorities, BC Cancer, Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA), and the Ministry of Health.**



Forming a cohort of physician experts in cancer care has proved invaluable, with an engaged group of subject matter experts leading this important work.



Joint project support from the Shared Care Committee, the Ministry of Health, BC Cancer, and PHSA resulted in deeper integration among partners than previously possible.

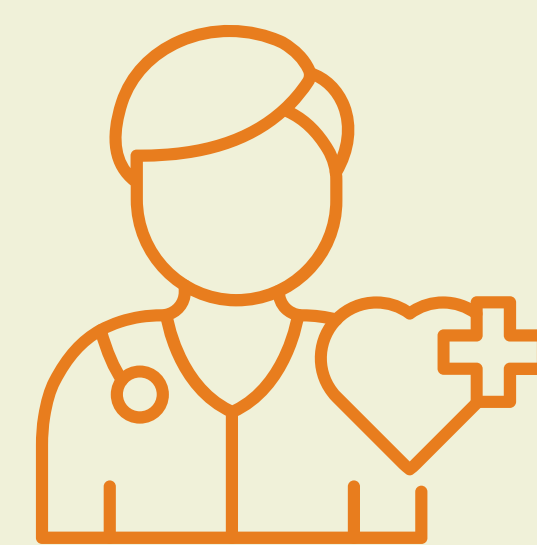
