 - This Early Pregnancy care pathway with clickable links & emailable patient info items makes it easier for primary care doctors to remember all the things to do in a first prenatal visit and to get them done more efficiently during a visit.
 - Algorithm has been used over 2,000 times by clinicians since it went live a few months ago.
 - Increasing awareness & use of this algorithm could help to ensure that time sensitive diagnostics are not missed while patients wait for their appointments at maternity clinics
