KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF SCC MEETING: August 7, 2019

PARTNERING WITH SHARED CARE

Each month the Shared Care Committee (SCC) reviews Expressions of Interest (EOIs) and Proposals submitted from communities/Divisions of Family Practice interested in engaging in Shared Care work. The following are details of approved 'New Partnerships' from the meeting.

NEW PARTNERSHIPS

Expressions of Interest

Approved 'EOIs' provide limited funds (under 15K) for initial exploration of a project of interest to a community.

- Time to Listen Powell River: A Rural Community's response to a youth mental health crisis - Powell River
- Child Advocacy Centre Central Okanagan
- <u>Transitions in Care</u> between Langley Memorial Hospital Hospitalists, Specialist and Primary Care - Langley
- Adult Mental Health and Substance Use Fraser Northwest

Proposals

Full project proposals are submitted after successful completion of an EOI.

- <u>Chronic Pain Spread Network</u> Thompson Region
- <u>Coordinating Complex Care</u> Regional Dementia Care Planning - Sunshine Coast
- Coordinating Complex Care Surrey-North Delta
- Open Conversations in Palliative Care East Kootenay
- Maternity Spread Network East Kootenay
- Surgical Patient Optimization Collaborative (SPOC)

The Specialist Services Committee (SSC) supported five pilot sites to become involved in SPOC. SSC has asked SCC to support an additional 12 sites at a cost of \$30,000 per site (\$360,000). SCC approved the funds from the \$1 million set aside for funding surgical optimization.

COMMITTEE UPDATES

- The SCC welcomed Carolyn Brandly, SCC Liaison for Vancouver Island, and staff lead for the Maternity Spread Network.
- The SCC also welcomed Kathy Chouinor as the Fraser Health Authority Representative.

PRESENTATIONS

SCC Strategic & Evaluation Plans – Robyn Kuropatwa, Paul Chaulk, RKL Health Informatics

- Robin and Paul presented on the draft strategic and evaluation plans for 2019-2021.
- The SCC focus is now evolving to provincial spread of successful innovations which requires change in priority setting, approaches, tactics and tools for the strategic plan.
- Paul provided an overview of the logic model and showcased two examples within the evaluation framework.
- The next steps for evaluation will be to design measures, integrate data collection into community activities, and develop reporting mechanisms.
- Both plans were accepted with SCC feedback.

Spread network process – Ray Grewal, SCC Liaison

- Ray Grewal presented on Shared Care's four <u>Spread Networks</u> —Maternity (24 communities), Chronic Pain (11 communities), Adult Mental Health and Substance Use (7 communities), and an emerging network for Palliative Care (2 communities).
- Network development involves the creation of an overall tactical spread plan, supported by a network steering group and community leadership tables.
- The model is to standardize processes across all network projects including EOIs, proposals, phases of work i.e., Phase 1 as the needs assessment phase and phase 2 as the project implementation phase.
- Each network will have an Advisory Committee and Terms of Reference.

FOCUS OF SHARED CARE COMMITTEE

Developing innovative approaches to improving collaboration between GPs, GPs with focused Practice, and specialist physicians, and spreading success through Spread Networks and other strategies.
