KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF SCC MEETING: December 4, 2019

PARTNERING WITH SHARED CARE

Each month the Shared Care Committee (SCC) reviews Expressions of Interest (EOIs) and Proposals submitted from communities/Divisions of Family Practice interested in engaging in Shared Care work. The following are details of approved 'new and ongoing' partnerships from the meeting.

NEW OR ONGOING PARTNERSHIPS

Approved Proposals

Palliative Care – Sunshine Coast Division

Building upon the work of the Powell River Division of Family Practice, this project will create a unified strategy for palliative care amongst GPs, specialists and the health authority.

- Chronic Pain Network Vancouver Division
- Coordinating Complex Care Cowichan Division
- Coordinating Complex Care Kootenay Boundary Division
- Emergency Preparedness Thompson Region Division

To Involve community physicians in developing a community emergency response plan that compliments the health authority acute care plan.

PRESENTATIONS

Presentation: White Rock South Surrey Division –
Pathways Referral Tracker Project (Ryan Lammersten,
Dr Tracy Monk, Dr Lisa Gaede, Dr Susan Lee, Cary
Sheppard)

- Pathways is an online resource allowing GPs and their office staff to quickly access referral information for specialists and specialty clinics. Pathways also includes a searchable database for patient and physician resources.
- A demonstration of the new Pathways Referral Tracker was provided. The Tracker is a dashboard that tracks the status of patient referrals, allows for secure messaging between clinics, and provides electronic notifications to patients.
- Shared Care has supported a GP-SP Referral Process Project in White Rock South Surrey (WRSS) as a pilot community for the Pathways Referral tracker initiated in February 2017, and partnering with Pathways in January 2018.
- The tracker is now used by 81% of GPs and 46% of Specialists in the WRSS Division.
- Before the tracker, referrals could take months to be acknowledged. 100% of referrals are now acknowledged in just over a week, and 25% are acknowledged within an hour.
- The tracker generates automated reminders for patients who consent to receive them. This has resulted in a 4% decrease in no-shows and has decreased the amount of time spent notifying patients.
- The WRSS project will expand to 5 additional Divisions: Surrey North Delta, North Shore, Abbotsford, Chilliwack and Mission. It was noted that the next wave of expansion in 2020/21 will require funding.
