## **Expressions of Interest**

Approved 'EOIs' provide limited funds (under 15K) for initial exploration of a project of interest to a community.

- <u>Adult Mental Health Substance Use Network</u> Chilliwack
- <u>Adult Mental Health Substance Use Network</u> Thompson Region

## SURGICAL PLAN UPDATE - Gary Sveinsen, Shared Care Liaison

• A Surgical Plan with the goal to **improve access to surgery and communication** between patients, families and providers was presented.

- The plan involves Shared Care collaboration with SSC, GPSC, Ministry of Health, and other partners (PSEC, HAs, etc.) to invite communities to engage in SCC activities to improve pre- and post-surgical patient transitions between physicians and health authority services.
- All communities are invited to participate (up to 16), along with the **five SSC prototype communities** already engaged in the initiative.

## **RACE REPORT & NEXT STEPS**

#### Ryan Williams, Tekara Organizational Effectiveness

- Shared Care engaged a consultant group, Tekara, to support the development of a program plan for RACE to achieve improvements recommended in a RACE evaluation.
- The RACE Steering Committee are aiming for a system with optimal value with interactions that are timely, collegial, culturally sensitive and educational.
- Tekara's recommended path for RACE:
  - It should work on immediate and practical improvements while exploring a technology strategy that supports ongoing innovations and additions.
  - This consists of two parts: 1) consolidate
    communications and RACE app improvements; and
    2) look at investing in distributed technology
    strategy.
- Discussion:
  - It was acknowledged that challenges remain around **fee codes** for the initiative.
  - Some updating will need to be done before services can be expanded across the province.
  - Conversations are being explored regarding how RACE fits with the developing Digital Health Strategy.

## FOCUS OF SHARED CARE COMMITTEE

Developing innovative approaches to improving collaboration between GPs, GPs with focused Practice, and specialist physicians, and spreading success through Spread Networks and other strategies.
