PARTNERING WITH SHARED CARE

Each month the Shared Care Committee (SCC) reviews Expressions of Interest (EOIs) and Proposals submitted from communities/Divisions of Family Practice interested in engaging in Shared Care work. The following are details of approved 'new and ongoing' partnerships from the meeting.

JCC CO-CHAIR UPDATE

Physician Funding for Planning & Accommodation

- Doctors of BC and the Ministry of Health (MoH) are working on a plan to remunerate physicians for their planning work for COVID-19.
- A MoH State of Emergency accommodation policy is being enacted during COVID, and is being adjusted to accommodate affected physicians. Details will be communicated shortly.

PRESENTATIONS

Shared Care Learning Centre – Carolyn Brandly

 A revised plan was presented to incorporate recommendations from the SCC March, 2020 meeting.

- The Learning Centre plan now includes an embedded searchable database with a listing of all SC projects, past and present. This takes advantage of concurrent work taking place to develop a project database for both internal and external use.
- Project listings will also include final reports,
 evaluations and specific resources developed for the project as applicable.
- Other sections of the Learning Centre will offer resources to guide those engaged in Shared Care work through the project lifecycle. This will include information on Shared Care principles, evaluation, criteria and templates for funding, as well as sections for general QI and resources that would be helpful to project teams.
- Once the full project listing and the web redevelopment are complete, it is anticipated that there will be a soft launch to gain some early traction with a full launch in early Fall 2020.
- It was noted that the Learning Centre will not be integrated with the SSC Exchange, but it may be possible to integrate them in the future, as they both use the same platform.

Patient Summaries Draft Implementation Plan - Dennis Lee and Valerie Nicol

- A draft "implementation plan" with a two year timeline, was presented for cross-provincial spread of the Victoria Patient Summaries project. The plan consists of two main phases:
 - Phase I: Prepare **project infrastructure**; **Communicate and engage** key decision makers.
 - Phase II: Communicate, engage, educate, and train stakeholders; Implement; Measure and adjust.
- It was noted that during Phase 1, the Shared Care team will solicit patient data to define scope, and explore technological solutions for uploading of patient summaries with the Digital Health Strategy team and Health Authorities.
- SCC approved proceeding with completing the work as identified in phase 1.
