WORKSHOP

SCC Draft Strategic Framework and 2022/23 Work Plan

- The strategic direction and approach of the draft workplan was approved in principle, with modifications to be made to include the following:
 - Guiding principles to be updated to reflect collaboration with other health care professionals, and to emphasise the importance of the team based care approach.
 - Expand entry points for physicians to obtain funding.
 - Further align evaluation and measurement with SCC / JCC Shared Measures work underway.

PRESENTATIONS | UPDATES

CYMHсу Community of Practice (CoP): Access to Justice Request and Update

- It is understood that family justice processes can be traumatic for children and youth involved in the system, and that the long term implications of Adverse Childhood Experiences on their mental and physical health, and the health care system, can be significant.
- In an effort to prevent ACEs and mitigate trauma, Access to Justice BC is inviting physicians to become involved in a 'Transform the Family Justice System (TFJS) Collaborative' through the CYMHсу CoP.
- SCC approved the request to support the collaboration, starting with virtual sessions to start the consultation process.
- CoP members will report back on findings and outcomes, and provide details of long-term expectations for the partnership beyond financially supporting physicians to engage in the TFJS development.

RACE Update and Funding Request

- The launch of the new RACE App is scheduled for January 2022.
- The development of the App has been challenging and complex due in part to a change in developers, and costs have been higher than expected.
- Consequently, further costs are being requested from SCC to cover the ongoing maintenance and development of the App.
- The Committee approved the new funding requests, and asked that terms for all future contractual agreements are clarified and firm.
- The issue of long-term RACE funding will be brought to the JCC Co-Chairs for consideration as part of the broader real-time virtual supports portfolio.
