WORKSHOP

Collaborative Structures Workshop | Jan 11

- A 'Collaborative Structures' workshop will take place January 11, 2022 for JCC committee members.
- The workshop will provide an opportunity for JCC members to better understand what avenues are available for alignment within SCC work and across the JCCs to support engagement and participation of physicians and partners in coordinated improvement initiatives.
- Draft Key learning objectives for participants include the ability to:
 - Describe key characteristics of networks

- Identify common frameworks for collaborative change efforts.

- Members were invited to consider what they are hoping to accomplish during the workshop and provide additional topics for discussion.

PRESENTATIONS | UPDATES

Workplan and Budget - Final approval of draft

- Following feedback, key updates were made to the draft workplan to include additional funds for 'Increasing Impact' to cover:
 - partnerships with other committees, spread of quality improvement work, surgical strategy support, and a needs assessment for an IHI style collaborative addressing Adult Mental Health and Substance Use
 - Increased funding for 'JCC Shared Commitments'
 - Full integration of evaluation linking to the Shared Measures.
- The Shared Care Committee approved the final draft of the 2022/23 workplan for submission to the Physician Services Committee.

Digital Health Strategy/Patient Summaries update

- Infoway are currently working with jurisdictions across the country to set national and technical standards for a patient summary.
- Implementation of this work is being led by the Doctors of BC and Ministry partners, with six physicians engaged to provide clinical feedback.
- A demonstration of the standards will be presented to vendors in February 2022.
- Next steps include:
 - a plan on how to technically support the Patient Summary sharing use cases
 - Hosting a January engagement event.
