## PRESENTATIONS

### PRESENTATION: Ridge Meadows Division of Family Practice – Treena Innes, Dr Melodie Prem-Smith, Dr Britt Bright, Leanne Regan and Cheryl Ashlie

- The Ridge Meadows Division provides health services to over 100,000 residents in Maple Ridge, Pitt Meadows and the Katzie First Nation.
- The division team described how partnering with Shared Care has made a difference in their community.
- In the past 7 years, Shared Care has invested \$1.6m in Ridge Meadows projects through 12 initiatives including:
  - Involvement in Adult Mental Health, Chronic Pain, and Maternity networks
  - Coordinating Complex Care for Older Adults
  - GP & Specialist Referral Improvement

- Ridge Meadows have strategized which SCC projects would complement and integrate well with their PCN strategy.
- The impact of Ridge Meadows SC projects have been sustainable, and are still providing benefits to the community after completion.
- it was noted that relationships between the Division and Health Authority are not dependent on individuals, but exist as part of a culture shift.
- Margaret English thanked Ridge Meadows Division and Executive Director, Treena Innes, for their continued work for patients and providers in their community.

### FOR DECISION: JCC Combined Event 2020

- At the April 2019 JCC Co-Chair meeting, it was suggested that the JCCs bring their larger member gatherings together into one joint event, to support alignment across the JCCs.
- Input was requested from the JCC Co-Chairs on the overall planning approach and approval to move forward on planning an integrated JCC Conference in the fall of 2020.
- Each year, the BC Patient Safety and Quality Council hosts the BC Quality Forum in Vancouver, bringing together health care providers, quality improvement leaders and system leadership for two days.
- The JCC's began partnering on this event in 2016, presenting a full day JCC Event on the day prior to the Quality Forum, as a pre-forum event.
- This has been a very successful partnership, drawing a wider audience of health system leaders to the work of the JCC's, and facilitating a major increase in physician participation in the Quality Forum.
- Shared Care approved the creation of a combined JCC strategic gathering in the fall, and the continuation of a separate showcase in partnership with the Quality forum each February.

### FOCUS OF SHARED CARE COMMITTEE

Developing innovative approaches to improving collaboration between GPs, GPs with focused Practice, and specialist physicians, and spreading success through Spread Networks and other strategies.
